Curtis L. Golkow of Fox Rothschild Speaks at Succession Planning Seminar

Curtis L. Golkow, a partner with Fox Rothschild LLP, recently presented at the Main Line Association for Continuing Education (MACE) CPE for CPA's seminar on Succession Planning. The seminar was held on May 8, 2008, at Penn State Great Valley in Malvern, Pennsylvania.

Golkow presented "Preparing & Implementing a Succession Plan – Is Your Client Ready?" The discussion focused on factors to consider in developing a succession plan as well as strategies for executing the plan, whether the business is being sold to an outsider or in a management buyout or being transferred to family members of the next generation. Golkow offered helpful advice to CPA's whose clients are engaged in pre-succession planning.

Golkow has been practicing corporate, securities, and finance law for 20 years, negotiating business deals and commercial matters for entrepreneurs, emerging companies, investors, lenders, and middle-market companies.
